OPINION

Misener Motor-Drayage Co., a corporation, requests permission from this Commission to temporarily suspend, for a period of six (6) months, all its operations as a highway common carrier of fruits, vegetables, berries, apples, etc., as heretofore conducted under authority of Decision No. 18129, dated March 30, 1927 on application No. 13521 whereby said corporation acquired the operating rights now proposed to be suspended.

Applicant alleges that due to the death of Frank Misener, an officer of the corporation, and manager therefore, and subsequent financial difficulties encountered, it has been impossible to purchase necessary equipment and continue the operation of this automotive transportation company.

This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Misener Motor-Drayage Co., a corporation be, and it is hereby authorized to temporarily suspend all its highway common carrier operations for the transportation of fruits, vegetables, berries, apples, etc., as heretofore

acquired under Decision No. 18129 dated March 30, 1927 on application No. 13521 until March 1, 1937 provided that applicant shall, on or before the expiration date of said suspension, either resume service or relinquish its operating right and provided further that applicant immediately file and make effective on five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public a supplement to its tariff and a time schedule showing suspension of service as authorized.
