O R D E R

The People of the State of California, on relation of the Department of Public Works, on May 14, 1936, applied for authority to construct a state highway known as Road VII-Ora-174-Ana, at grade across the tracks of Southern Pacific Company, in the City of Anaheim, County of Orange. Southern Pacific Company, on June 12, 1936, signified, in writing, that it has no objection to the construction of said crossing at grade.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein; that it is neither reasonable nor practicable at this time to provide a grade separation or to avoid a grade crossing with said tracks at the point mentioned and that the application should be granted, subject to certain conditions,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the People of the State of California, on relation of the Department of Public Works, are hereby authorized to construct Road VII-Ora-174-Ana, at grade across the tracks of Southern Pacific Company, at the location more particularly described in the application and as shown by the map (Exhibit "A") attached thereto, subject to the following conditions and not otherwise:

- (1) The above crossing shall be identified as Crossing No. BK-509-18.
- (2) The entire expense of constructing the crossing shall be borne by applicant. The cost or maintenance of that portion of said crossing up to lines two (2) feet outside of the outside rails shall be borne by applicant. The maintenance of that portion of the crossing between lines two (2) feet outside of the outside rails shall be borne by Southern Pacific Company. Southern Pacific Company shall perform all actual work of constructing the crossing between lines two (2) feet outside of the outside rails.
- (3) The crossing shall be constructed of a width of not less than seventy-four (74) feet and at an angle to the railroad approximately as shown on Exhibit "A" attached to the application, and with grades of approach not greater than two (2) per cent; shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as standard No. 3 in this Commission's General Order No. 72, and shall in every way be made suitable for the passage thereon of vehicles and other road traffic.
- (4) Two standard No. 5 signals, as specified in General Order No. 75-A of this Commission, shall be installed at the sole expense of applicant, for the protection of said crossing of Road VII-Ora-174-2na, Crossing No. BK-509-18. The maintenance of these protective devices shall thereafter be borne by Southern Pacific Company.
- (5) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the completion of the installation of said crossing and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.
- (6) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.
- (7) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, public convenience and necessity demand such action.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
