## SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Western Pacific Railroad Company has filed its Second Supplemental Application in the above entitled proceeding, requesting authority to install a type of signal not in conformity with the provisions of the Commission's General Order No. 75-A, at Crossing No. 4-113.3 of State Highway No. 53 with its tracks in the vicinity of Thornton Station, San Joaquin County. Said signal is of a type approved by the United States Bureau of Public Roads and is being installed with funds made available for crossing protection by the Federal Government.

It appearing that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the authority requested should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that The Western Pacific Railroad Company is hereby authorized to install two flashing light signals of the type commonly known as A.R.A. Standard at Crossing No. 4-113.3, San Joaquin County.
