TENTH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

San Jose Water Works, in its tenth supplemental application filed in the above entitled matter on September 28, 1936, reports that it has on deposit with American Trust company, trustee, the sum of \$42,876.34 obtained from the sale of its bonds authorized by Decision No. 27267, dated August 9, 1934.

Under the order of the Commission the company may expend the \$42,876.34 only for such purposes as the Commission might authorize. Accordingly it has requested permission to use said sum of \$42,876.34 to reimburse its treasury to that extent for additions and betterments made to its water system during the period from April 1, 1936 to August 31, 1936, which additions and betterments are reported in the said supplemental petition at a net amount of \$65,497.49, as follows:-

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that San Jose Water Works be, and it hereby is, authorized to withdraw from American Trust Company, Trustee, \$42,876.34 of the proceeds received through the issue and sale of the bonds authorized by Decision No. 27267, dated August 9, 1934, for the purpose of reimbursing its treasury on account of moneys expended for the additions and betterments to its water system during the period from April 1, 1936 to August 31, 1936 referred to herein.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 27267, dated August 9, 1934, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this Tenth Supplemental Order.
