BY THE COMMISSION:

TENTH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

East Bay Transit Company, on January 4, 1937, filed its supplemental application asking for authority to abandon street car service upon East 14th Street between 105th Avenue in the City of Oakland and Dutton Avenue, in the City of San Leandro.

Applicant alleges that it has been requested by the City of San Leandro to abandon said tracks; that their removal will relieve a traffic hazard on that portion of East 14th Street; that the territory is served by its motor coach lines operating along East 14th Street; that its patrons use said motor coach service exclusively; that the discontinuance of said street car line will eliminate a duplication of service; and that public convenience and necessity no longer require the operation of said street car service.

The City of San Leandro advised the Commission, in writing, that it is agreeable to the abandonment of said street car service and that the abandonment will correct a hazardous traffic condition at Dutton Avenue and East 14th Street.

It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary; that public convenience and necessity do not require the operation of said street car service; and that

the supplemental application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that East Bay Transit Company is hereby authorized to abandon street car service on that portion of East 14th Street, from 105th Avenue in the City of Oakland to Dutton Avenue in the City of San Leandro, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Applicant shall give not less than ten (10) days' notice to the public of said abandonment of service by posting notices in its street cars and motor coaches operating along East 14th Street.
- (2) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify the Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of service authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.
- (3) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
