O R D E R

Union Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, on December 31, 1936, applied for authority to abandon and remove its freight and passenger station building and a house track located at Rowland, Los Angeles County.

Applicant states that no business has been transacted at this station for several years; that in its opinion there will be no receivers or shippers of freight affected by the change proposed and that the continued maintenance of the station is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

California Farm Bureau Federation, on January 6, 1937, signified in writing that it does not object to the granting of this application.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Union Pacific Railroad Company is hereby authorized to abandon and remove its freight and passenger station building and house track at Rowland, Los Angeles County; to eliminate said station from its records and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules pertaining thereto.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
