BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Condition (2) of the Order in Decision No. 29043 in
the above application required a filing of certain rates,
rules and regulations, as follows:

"Applicants shall file, in quadruplicate,
within a period of not to exceed thirty
(30) days from the date hereof, a tariff
or tariffs constructed in accordance
with the requirements of the Commission's
General Orders and containing rates and
rules which in volume and effect, shall
be identical with the rates and rules
shown in the application, or rates and
rules satisfactory to the Railroad
Commission."

Rules and Regulations and rate schedules were filed
within the time specified, but were found to be in non-
compliance with the Commission's General Order No. 54, as
well as to be otherwise in error.

Applicant has now filed, on January 12, 1937, under
Advice No. 1, C.R.C. Sheets Nos. 1 to 38, inclusive. This
filing appears to be satisfactory and good cause appearing,

and as this is not a matter which requires a public hearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the time requirement under Condition (2) of Decision No. 29043 be extended to permit the filing under Advice No. 1 made January 12, 1937, and that such filing be considered as fulfilling the requirements of Condition (2), and that said filing become effective February 12, 1937.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in all other respects the provisions in the General Order of Decision No. 29043 shall remain in full force and effect.

This Supplemental Order shall become effective on the date hereof.
