BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

California-Nevada Stages, Inc., filed requests with this Commission on December 22, 1936, and January 11, 1937, copies of which were sent to the interested parties in the above numbered applications, asking that Decision No. 29290, dated November 23, 1936, as amended by Decision No. 29381, dated December 18, 1936, be further amended providing a further restriction with respect to Pacific Greyhound Lines, Inc., that "no passengers, baggage or express originating from or destined to points outside of the territory now served by California-Nevada Stages, Inc., shall be transported between Sacramento on the one hand and Marysville and Yuba City on the other."

After due consideration of said request and the entire record in these proceedings, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Condition (2) on page 19 of Decision No. 29290, as amended in Decision No. 29381, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

- (2) (A) No passengers, baggage or express shall be transported between San Francisco-Oakland and/or Sacramento on the one hand and the territory along, between and including Roseville and Chico on the other, either
 - (a) Via Red Bluff or Proberta, or
 - (b) Via the route herein authorized between Roseville and Chico upon and along Highway U. S. 99E.
- (B) No passengers, baggage or express shall be transported locally between Stockton, Lodi and Woodbridge and intermediate points on the one hand, and North Sacramento and Yuba City and intermediate points on the other hand; nothing herein contained to prevent the handling of passengers, baggage and express by Pacific Greyhound Lines from the restricted area of Stockton, Lodi, Woodbridge, and intermediate points into Sacramento for interchange with California-Nevada Stages when

destined to the area North Sacramento and
Yuba City and intermediates, or vice versa.

In all other respects said Decisions Nos. 29290
and 29381 shall remain in full force and effect.
