ORDER

J. C. Mims, owner of Mulberry Water Works, a public utility serving water for domestic purposes in territory adjacent to the easterly portion of the City of Chico, has asked permission to transfer said Mulberry Water Works to his daughter, Sydney Mims. The water system serves 21 consumers. It consists of a well, an 18,000 gallon tank and 2750 feet of pipe varying from one to four inches in diameter. A new pump and motor was installed during 1936. J. C. Mims acquired the water system under the authority granted by Decision No. 28564 dated February 10, 1936.

J. C. Mims asks permission to transfer the properties to his daughter, Sydney Mims, as a gift. He will continue to supervise the operation and maintenance of the water works property.

The Commission has considered applicant's request and is of the opinion that this is not a matter on which a hearing is necessary, and that this application should be granted, subject to the provisions of this order, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that J. C. Mims be, and he is hereby, authorized to transfer on or before June 30, 1937, to Sydney Mims his public utility water properties known as Mulberry Water Works.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that within thirty(30) days after the transfer of the said properties, J. C. Mims shall file with the Railroad Commission a copy of the deed or bill of sale or other instrument of conveyance executed to effect said transfer.
