O R D E R

The Commission, by Decision No. 25355, dated November 14, 1932, issued its General Order No. 90 prescribing "Safety Rules and Operating Regulations for Automotive Passenger Carriers Operating in Interstate Service."

The Interstate Commerce Commission, by its Ex Parte MC-4, dated December 23, 1936, issued "Rules and Regulations governing qualifications of employees, and safety of operation and equipment of common carriers and contract carriers by motor vehicle," subject to the Motor Carriers' Act of 1935.

Due to the action of the Interstate Commerce Commission it appears that our General Order No. 90 is no longer necessary and should be revoked, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 25355, promulgating General Order No. 90, and supplement thereto (Decision No. 26365), be and the same are hereby revoked and of no further force and effect.
