ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The first of these complaints was filed on October 10, 1932, and the second on March 8, 1933. Both challenged the reasonableness of the gas rates then being charged by the defendant utility. After several days of hearing in 1933 before former Commissioner Seavey, further proceedings seem to have been held in abeyance with the acquiescence of all parties, pending informal negotiations concerning rate reductions offered by the utility and later made effective. In view of the long pendency of these matters, and the fact that the issuance now of any order fixing the rates of defendant would compel the making of a new record, we are of the opinion that an order of dismissal without prejudice should be entered.

Therefore, good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED by the Railroad

Commission of the State of California that each of the above entitled complaints be and they are hereby dismissed.
