OPINION AND ORDER ON PETITION
FOR MODIFICATION OF DECISION

The Commission by its Decision No. 30089, dated September 7, 1937, granted a certificate to petitioner, reading in part, "...for the transportation only of live and dressed poultry in coops from Corning, Orland, Willows, Maxwell and Williams, on the one hand, and Oakland and San Francisco, on the other...".

Petitioner is now requesting a modification of Decision No. 30089 by deleting therefrom the phrase "in coops" as it appears in the order of said decision and a further modification of said decision authorizing the southbound transportation of eggs, fresh meat, olives and grain.

It appearing that the request for deletion of the phrase "in coops" is well founded,

IT IS ORDERED that the first paragraph of the order of Decision No. 30089, dated September 7, 1937, is amended to read as follows:

Public hearings having been held in the above entitled proceeding, and the matter now being ready for decision, the Railroad Commission of the State of California hereby declares that public convenience and necessity require the operation by A. W. Hays of an automotive truck service as a highway common carrier for the transportation of live and dressed poultry, and of no other commodities, from Corning, Orland, Willows, Maxwell and Williams, on the one hand, to Oakland, and San Francisco, on the other hand.

Petition for further modification of Decision No. 30089 to permit the southbound transportation of eggs, fresh meat, olives and grain having been filed by applicant, the Commission having carefully considered said petition, and each and every allegation contained therein, and being of the opinion that no good cause for the granting of such modification is therein made to appear,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that said petition in all respects, except as herein above modified, is hereby denied.
