ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In this application filed July 6, 1935, a certificate of public convenience and necessity was sought for the operation of a tank truck service for the carriage of bulk wines as a common carrier between various points in this state.

A public hearing was held on this application on September 17 and 18, 1935, at which time the matter was dropped from the Commission's calendar.

Thereafter, on October 14, 1935, the Commission issued its Decision No. 28275 authorizing the substitution of Herman Weebke for the original applicant.

IT APPEARING that applicant having failed to reply to numerous written requests of the Commission to advise it as to applicant's position in the matter, and having failed to diligently prosecute said application, and the Commission being fully advised in the premises believes that the application should be dismissed for lack of prosecution.

Now, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 20051 is dismissed.
