FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

ORIGINAL

Manteca Telephone Company, a corporation, having applied to the Railroad Commission for permission to execute a deed of trust and a one year 7% promissory note in the principal amount of \$4,000.00 for the purpose of paying the note for like amount issued under authority granted by Decision No. 25727, dated March 13, 1938, and the Commission being of the opinion that the request should be granted, as herein provided, that the money, property or labor to be procured or paid for through the issue of the note is reasonably required for the purpose specified herein and that the expenditure for such purpose is not, in whole or in part reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Manteca Telephone Company be, and it hereby is, authorized to execute a deed of trust in or substantially in the same form as that filed in this proceeding on March 4, 1938, provided that the authority herein given is for the purpose of this proceeding only and is given only insofar as this Commission has jurisdiction under the terms of the Public Utilities Act and is not intended as an approval of said deed of trust as to such other legal requirements to which it may be subject.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Manteca Telephone Company be, and it hereby is, authorized to issue, on or before April 15, 1938, its one year 7% note for \$4,000.00 to pay or renew the note for

like amount now outstanding, which note it issued under authority granted by Decision No. 25727, dated March 13, 1938.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the authority herein granted shall become effective upon the date hereof.
