for an Order granting leave to temporarily suspend public warehouse service at its Vallejo Nos. 2 and 3 Warehouse in San Francisco, on less than thirty (30) days' notice.

BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant is a corporation operating and maintaining public warehouses in the City and County of San Francisco for the commercial storage of general merchandise. Rates, rules and regulations governing this service are contained in California Warehouse Tariff Bureau Warehouse Tariffs C.R.C. Nos. 14, 83 and 98 of L.A. Bailey, Agent.

By application filed March 29, 1938, applicant alleges that due to present business trends it finds it inexpedient to continue its lease on the warehouses located at 734-750 Battery Street and 119 Broadway Street (Vallejo No. 2 and Vallejo No. 3). It seeks authority to suspend service at these warehouses for a period of one year. Should business conditions improve within that period, it proposes to renew operations at Vallejo Warehouses Nos. 2 and 3 if the premises are available, or to acquire or build other equally suitable facilities of the

same size. The space of the warehouses involved is approximately 70,000 square feet.

Applicant alleges that there is ample vacant warehouse space in the district in which the Vallejo Warehouses are located, that storage may be obtained at such other warehouses or at its own located elsewhere in San Francisco, and that the public will not be inconvenienced by reason of the proposed temporary suspension.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the South End Warehouse Company be and it is hereby authorized to suspend warehouse operation as a public utility at Vallejo Warehouse No. 2, located at 734-750 Battery Street and Vallejo Warehouse No. 3, located at 119 Broadway, both warehouses in the City and County of San Francisco, for a period of one year from the date of this order provided that California Warehouse Tariff Bureau, Warehouse Tariffs C.R.C. Nos. 14, 83 and 98 of L.A. Bailey, Agent be supplemented immediately to show that its service has been suspended as authorized herein.

This order shall be effective ten (10) days from the date hereof.
