FIFTE SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following paragraph be and it is hereby added to Rule 20, Section No. 1 of Appendix A to Decision No. 30370, as amended:

"(t) Vehicles and property transported in or on vehicles by

Mare Island Ferry;
Martinez, Benicia Ferry and Transportation Co.;
Richmond and San Rafael Ferry and Transportation Co.; or
Southern Pacific Golden Gate Ferries, Ltd."

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the following rule be and it is hereby added to said Appendix A:

"RULE NO. 55- MIXED SHIPMENTS

When one or more commodities for which rates are not provided in this appendix are included in a mixed shipment with commodities for which rates are herein provided, the mixed shipment may be rated under this Appendix, the contraband commodities to be charged for in accordance with ratings

provided therefor in the Current Classification or Current Exception Sheet, subject to the rates, rules and regulations in this appendix.

If a lower basis is obtained by rating one or more portions of the mixed shipment separately, such lower basis shall apply."

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the changes herein made shall become effective April 15, 1938. Common carriers as defined in the Public Utilities Act may file appropriate tariff provisions consistent with the amendments contained in this order, on not less than three (3) days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

In all other respects said Decision No. 30370, as amended shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
