ORDER OF REVOCATION

ORIGINAL

On February 26, 1925, the Commission issued its Decision No. 14612, on Application No. 10850, granting a certificate to J. A. Manor to transport passengers, express, baggage and freight between Princeton and Colusa and intermediate points. Prior to the granting of such certificate J. A. Manor had established a prescriptive operating right for the transportation of passengers and packages between Williams and Colusa and more recently the Commission in its Decision No. 30711, on Application No. 21751, authorized H. W. Manor, as executor of the last will of J. A. Manor, deceased, to transfer to George Kister the prescriptive right referred to. The Commission is now informed by counsel for the Manor estate that the operation authorized by Decision No. 14612 had been abandoned many years ago and that no future operation is contemplated thereunder.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate granted by Decision No. 14612, on Application No. 10850, is revoked and annulled, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all rates, fares, rules and regulations, and time schedules, covering the service heretofore

given between Princeton and Colusa and intermediate points are hereby cancelled.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
