BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

By this application C. J. Nagel, doing business as Red Line Parcel Service, seeks authority to discontinue service as a highway common carrier of property between San Jose and Cottage Grove District, city of Willow Glen, Burbank, Sunol District, city of Santa Clara and intermediate points.

Applicant alleges as justification for the granting of authority to discontinue such service that since the annexation of Willow Glen to San Jose, deliveries to the above outlying districts average less than ten (10) packages per day and these deliveries can and will be handled by bicycles.

Applicant in the instant application requested authority to discontinue service as a common carrier of persons and property. It is evident that the request in respect to the discontinuance of service as a common carrier of persons was inadvertently made, as applicant possesses no certificate of public convenience and necessity for the transportation of passengers.

The operating right herein proposed to be discontinued was created by Decision No. 22681, dated July 17, 1930, on Application No. 16602.

This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary; the application will be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that C. J. Nagel, doing business as Red Line Parcel Service, be, and he is hereby, authorized to discontinue and abandon his highway common carrier service for the transportation of property between San Jose and Cottage Grove District, city of Willow Glen, Burbank, Sunol District, Santa Clara and intermediate points, and all tariffs and time schedules therefor be, and they hereby are, cancelled.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Decision No. 22681, dated July 17, 1930, on Application No. 16602, be and the same is hereby revoked and annulled.

For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
