OPINION AND ORDER

Coalinga Consolidated Water Company, a corporation, heretofore engaged in the business of operating a water system as a public utility near the City of Coalinga, in Fresno County, asks for authority to discontinue public utility service.

An investigation has been made which discloses the facts that no public utility or any other water service has been rendered by applicant company since the year 1932; that all its former consumers have developed their own sources of water supply, resulting in the abandonment by the company of all its operating facilities. It therefore appears that a public hearing in this matter is not necessary and that the request for permission to be relieved of its public utility obligations and liabilities is warranted and should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Coalinga Consolidated Water Company, a corporation, be and it is hereby authorized to discontinue all public utility water service by and through its water works located in the vicinity of the City of Coalinga in

the County of Fresno, and it is hereby relieved of all further public utility obligations and liabilities in connection with said water works and appurtenant facilities.

This Order shall become effective immediately.
