ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR MODIFICATION

By petition filed November 19, 1937, Pacific Electric Railway Company, Southern Pacific Company and Union Pacific Railroad Company sought a modification of Decision No. 29267 of November 9, 1936, as amended, in the above entitled proceeding, to permit the publication of a rate of 27 cents per 100 pounds for transportation of refined petroleum products in tank cars, from Group 6 points as specified in said decision to points in the Imperial Valley. Petitioners alleged that said rate was necessary to relate the intrastate rate with a rate of 28 cents per 100 pounds, in effect via a route through the Republic of Mexico. Before action was taken in the matter, petitioners advised the Commission that they did not desire to prosecute the petition and requested that it be denied without prejudice. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that petition of Pacific Electric Railway Company, Southern Pacific Company and Union Pacific Railroad Company filed November 19, 1937, in the above entitled proceeding, be and it is hereby denied without prejudice.
