OPINION AND ORDER

By an application filed June 27, 1938, Edward Malde, doing business as A B C Transfer & Storage Company, seeks authority to transport household goods, furniture and personal effects, and to perform certain accessorial services in connection therewith, under a contract with the United States Navy Department, to expire December 31, 1938, at rates less than those established by Decision No. 28810, as amended, in Case No. 4086.

Applicant alleges that the rates now sought are identical with those heretofore authorized by the Commission in Decision No. 30777, dated April 11, 1938, in Application No. 21671, in connection with a similar contract with the Navy Department which terminated June 30, 1938.

It appears from the application that the rates proposed for the performance of transportation and accessorial services for the United States Navy Department are the same as those heretofore authorized by Decision No. 30777, supra, and that this is a metter in which a public hearing is not necessary; therefore, good cause appearing,
