SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

A petition for modification of Decision No. 30021 of August 9, 1937, as amended, in the above entitled proceedings, has been filled by the California Portland Cement Company seeking the establishment of reduced rates for the transportation of cement in quantities of 28,500 pounds or more delivered within a 24 hour period, between points within the San Diego drayage area. Petitioner requests that, exclusive of ferry fees, a rate of $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents per 100 pounds be established for the first $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles plus $\frac{1}{2}$ cent per 100 pounds for each additional 5 miles. It represents that shipments of 28,000 pounds or more are adapted to efficient and economic loading, unloading and handling and that the suggested rates will return adequate revenue for the service required.

By Decision No. 30837 of May 5, 1938, in Cases Nos. 3981. 4071 and 4121 and Application No. 21172, the Commission, among other things, established minimum rates of the volume of those here sought for similar transportation wholly within Los Angeles County and for movements beyond railheads through a wide territory in southern California for distances not exceeding 122 miles. For greater distances we established rates on a slightly lower basis. Although the effective date of that decision has been suspended by the filing of petitions for rehearing, said petitions did not challenge the propriety of the particular rates mentioned. Operating conditions in the transportation of cement within the San Dicgo drayage area do not appear to be substantially different from those attending like transportation within the territory covered by said Decision No. 30837, and the establishment of minimum rates not higher than those contained in Decision No. 30837 seems justified. The order herein will establish rates substantially of the volume of those contained in Decision No. 30837. If other or different relief is desired the matter will be set for public hearing.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Appendix "A" of Decision No. 30021 dated August 9, 1937, as amended, in the above entitled proceedings be and it is hereby further amended by adding the following item:
