SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

OBIGINAL Applicant, due to change in trackage plan, requests, by amended application, that Decision No. 31093, dated July 7, 1938, be annulled and that authority be granted to install two spur tracks in and along Vallejo Street and across Battery Street in San Francisco, at the location shown in said amended application.

Good cause appearing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 31093 is revoked and of no further force and effect.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED THAT Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct two spur tracks at grade along Vallejo Street and across Battery Street in San Francisco at the location described in the amended application to be operated over by State Belt Railroad. Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G.O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the streets now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding six per cent. Protection shall be by existing Standard No. 1 crossing sign. (G.O. No. 75-A).

Applicant shall remove the track, shown in yellow on the mep (Coast Division Drawing No. 25566, revised September 14, 1938) attached to amended application, crossing a portion of said Vallejo Street, and shall repair the roadway to conform to the remainder thereof.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year (unless time be extended), or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
