ORDER VACATING ORDER OF SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION

By order dated February 17, 1939, the Commission suspended until May 23, 1939, the operation of Local Excursion Tariffs Nos. 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, C.R.C. Nos. 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, respectively, of Airline Bus Company (Joseph Miller, Owner), naming round-trip excursion fares for the transportation of persons from various points located between Hollister and Los Angeles to San Francisco and return. Thereafter, under authority of Special Permissions Nos. 63-15175 and 15-23196, dated February 27, 1939, the suspended rates were voluntarily withdrawn and the schedules cancelled. The cause for suspension having been removed, the order of suspension will be vacated and the proceeding discontinued.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the order of suspension and investigation in the above entitled proceeding be and it is hereby vacated and that this proceeding be and it is hereby discontinued.
