SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Union Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, and Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, having on June 2nd, 1939, requested in writing that Decision No. 31998, dated May 16th, 1939, on the above entitled proceeding, be modified so as to require the City of Pomona to take all necessary steps to legally abandon and effective close the existing public grade crossing at Cypress Avenue; and good cause appearing;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the first ordering paragraph on page 5 of the typewritten copy of this Commission's Opinion and Order in Decision No. 31998 shall be amended by adding the following condition:

(1) The City Council of the City of Pomona shall file with this Commission a certified copy of an appropriate ordinance or ordinances, duly and regularly passed, instituting all necessary steps to legally abandon and effectively close the existing public grade crossing at Cypress Avenue, identified as Crossing No. B-513.92 (Southern Pacific Company), and Crossing No. 3-31.6 (Union Pacific Railroad Company), and described as follows:

That portion of Cypress Avenue in the City of Pomona, California, lying between the prolongation of the north line of First Street and a line parallel with and distant northerly 100 feet, measured at right angles, from the prolongation of the north line of said First Street.

In all other respects, Decision No. 31998 shall remain in full force and effect.
