OPINION AND ORDER

In this application The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company requests authority to modify its rates for toll telephone service between Seigler Springs, Lake County, California, and certain other toll points in California.

It is stated in the application that the location of Seigler Springs was incorrectly shown on the United States Post Route Map and that this resulted in certain irregularities in the computation of rates to thirty-four (34) toll rate points. The correction of these irregularities will result in increasing the rates in twelve (12) instances five cents each and in decreasing the charges five cents each in twenty-two (22) cases. The revenue effect will be a small decrease in the charges for service over these thirty-four (34) toll routes.

The application of the correct rates is required so that equitable and nondiscriminatory rates and charges may be maintained on the basis of the toll rate plan effective throughout applicant's service territory in California.

The Commission has given consideration to this application and is of the opinion that the request should be granted, and that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not required, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company shall:

- (1) Correct its interexchange telephone rate schedules applicable to messages to and from Seigler Springs toll station as shown in Exhibit "B" attached to the application, effective on or before August 1, 1939.
- (2) Submit to the Railroad Commission of the State of California for filing, in accordance with General Order No. 68, the interexchange rates referred to in (1) above not later than five days immediately preceding their effective date.

For all other purposes the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
