FIFTH APPLICATION FOR LEAVE TO AMEND PETITION

The petition of Sacramento Municipal Utility District, a municipal utility district, respectfully shows that:

I.

On the 20th day of May, 1938, the Board of Directors of said District did, at a meeting of said Board, by its Rosolution No. 806, which was duly passed by unanimous vote of all of the members of said Board, determine that the public interest and necessity demand the acquisition by said District under eminent domain proceedings, certain rights, lands and other properties as therein described for public use by said District in connection with the operation and maintenance of an electric system and works for the distribution of electric energy.

Said resolution did direct the bringing of appropriate eminent domain proceedings and specifically directed the filing of a petition before the Railroad Commission of the State of California, pursuant to Section 47(b) of the Public Utilities Act.

II.

On the 21st day of May, 1938, said District did, pursuant to said Resolution No. 806, file a petition with Railroad Commission of the State of California, praying said Commission

to fix and determine the just compensation to be paid for an 1 electric distribution system, existing within and adjacent to 2 the boundaries of said District. On the 25th day of May, 1939, the Board of Directors of said District did, at a meeting of said Board, by its Resolution No. 863, which was duly passed by a unanimous vote of all of the members of said Board, further amend said Resolution No. 806, as amended by Resolution No. 842, as amended by Resolution No. 856, by amending in certain respects the form of petition to be filed before the Railroad Commission and directed the filing of a fourth application for leave to amend said petition so filed on the 21st day of May, 1938, as the same had been amended by Decision No. 31693, Decision No. 31765, and Decision No. 31933 of said Railroad Commission.

XIII.

On the 29th day of May, 1939, said District, did pursuant to Resolution No. 863, file its fourth application for leave to amend with the Railroad Commission of the State of California, praying said Commission to authorize the amendment of said petition filed on the 21st day of May, 1938, as amended by Decision No. 31693, Decision No. 31765, and Decision No. 31933, of said Railroad Commission, in the respects provided for

and set forth in said Resolution No. 863.

XIV.

On the 11th day of July, 1939, said Commission did, by its Decision No. 32153, authorize said amendments and did amend said petition in each and all of the respects prayed for in said fourth application for leave to amend.

XV.

On the 27th day of July, 1939, the Board of Directors of said District did, at a meeting of said Board, by its Resolution No. 869, which was duly passed by a unanimous vote of all of the members of said Board, further amend said Resolution No. 806, as amended by Resolution No. 842, as amended by Resolution No. 850, as amended by Resolution No. 856, as amended by Resolution No. 856, as amended by Resolution No. 863, by amending in certain respects the form of petition to be filed before said Railroad Commission and directed the filing of this fifth application for leave to amend said petition so filed on the 21st day of May, 1938, as the same has been amended by Decision No. 31693, Decision No. 31765, Decision No. 31933, and Decision No. 32153 of said Railroad Commission.

XVI.

The amendments for which authorization is hereinbelow prayed will, if authorized, further amend said petition in the same respects and manner that said Resolution No. 869 did further amend the form of petition set forth in and provided for by said Resolution No. 806, as amended by said Resolution No. 842, as amended by said Resolution No. 850, as amended by said Resolution No. 856, as amended by said Resolution No. 863.

conduit underneath the bridge over the Sacramento River at the 1 westerly end of M Street in the City of Sacramento to the 2 easterly tower pier of said bridge; thence extend vertically 3 on the easterly tower of said bridge to, and terminating at, a 4 point 30 feet above the floor of said bridge; 5 "EXCEPTING, FURTHER, said two and one-half inch con-6 duit between said manhole and said point which is thirty feet 7 above the floor of said bridge. 8 "Paragraph 4.55.2 - The manhole which is located 9 between 10 feet and 20 feet northerly of the northeast corner 10 of that parcel of real property described hereinbefore in Sub-11 Item 3.3 and designated therein as Station B; 12 "TOGETHER WITH all conduit which extend from the 13 easterly side of said manhole; 14 "IT BEING INTENDED that no electric conductors and 15 equipment shall be included with the manhole and conduit de-16 scribed in this paragraph. 17 "Paragraph 4.55.3 - The manhole located between the 18 Courthouse of the County of Sacramento, which is the building 19 on the easterly side of I Street between 6th and 7th Streets 20 in the City of Sacramento, and the building located at the 21 southeasterly corner of the intersection of 6th and H Streets 22 in said City, at a point between 85 feet and 100 feet easterly 23 of the easterly line of said 6th Street; 24 "TOGETHER WITH all conductors and equipment contained 25 in said manhole and/or extending therefrom; 26 "EXCEPTING, HOWEVER, those conductors and their 27 encasing conduits, which extend continuously from west of the 28 easterly line of Sixth Street; through the southerly part of 29 said manhole, to the jail building which is northeasterly of 30 said manhole; provided that no other conductors which are 31 spliced onto said conductors in said manhole are included with 32 -15said conductors."

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XVIII.

Following the language inserted after line 39, page 50 of Exhibit A, pursuant to line 17, page 10, to line 10, page 12, inclusive, of said Fourth Application for Leave to Amend, the following be inserted:

"Sub-Item 4.71 Exception of Electric Conductors.

Extending Between Randall and

Vorden River Crossings.

"The three electric conductors which are highest in point of distance above the ground at the spliced wooden pole which is the point of beginning of the route hereinafter described and which are the conductors which extend along the entire route described as follows, to-wit:

"Beginning at the one of the two spliced wooden poles referred to hereinbefore in Sub-Item 4.64 which is on the left bank of the Sacramento River; thence from said point of beginning southerly for a distance of between 395 feet and 405 feet to a pole from which electric conductors extend in four directions; thence westerly, southwesterly, southerly and southeasterly following the general downstream course of the Sacramento River without at any point being more than three-fourths of one mile distant from the left bank of said river to a pole located between 295 feet and 310 feet northeasterly from the northeasterly wall of the building located between the four legs of the steel tower referred to hereinbefore in Sub-Item 4.63; thence southwesterly to, and terminating at, the point where said three conductors intersect the northeasterly line of the area between the four legs of said tower;

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"TOGETHER WITH:

"(1) Any and all insulators, insulating devices, insulating materials, switches, and switching stations, switching devices, switch operating mechanisms, cutouts, fuses, disconnects, disconnecting devices, transformers and transformer stations, transforming devices, grounds, grounding devices, protectors, protective devices, protective materials, regulators, regulating devices, controllers, controlling devices, contacting devices, meters, terminals, terminating devices, potheads, splices, splicing devices, splicing materials, connectors, connecting devices, and electric lamps which are attached to, or are physically or electrically connected to the conductors described hereinbefore in this sub-item;

"(2) Any and all towers, poles, pole structures, crossarms, guying devices, bracing devices, brackets, street lighting fixtures, conduits (underground, pole riser and other), vaults, manholes, handholes, junction boxes, service boxes, meter boxes, fuse boxes, switch boxes, and buildings, any of which are physically connected to, or which enclose or encase, (a) the conductors described hereinbefore in this sub-item, or (b) any of the articles, devices, structures, or equipment which are hereinbefore listed or indicated in this sub-item;

"EXCEPTING, HOWEVER, one-half interest and partial rights of use in certain poles as indicated in Paragraph 4.50.5 of Sub-Item 4.50;

"PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the three conductors above described in this sub-item include only that portion of said three conductors which follows the route particularly described hereinbefore and do not include any other conductors which are physically or electrically connected or may be physically or electrically connected by means of switches or other devices to said three conductors;

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"IT BEING INTENDED that the District shall not acquire said three conductors extending continuously from the point of beginning to the terminus of the route described hereinbefore in this sub-item." XIX. Line 24, page 55, to line 10, page 56, inclusive, of Exhibit A to said Petition, be stricken therefrom. XX. All of Exhibit G to said Petition be stricken there-from.
