OPINION AND ORDER

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company in this application requests authority to modify its rates for toll telephone service between Calpine, Sierra County, and certain other California toll rate points.

It is stated in the application that the location of Calpine was incorrectly shown on the United States Post Route Map and that this resulted in certain irregularities in the computations of rates to and from twenty (20) toll rate points. The correction of these irregularities will result in increasing the rates for eight (8) routes five cents each, and in decreasing the rates five cents each for the other twelve (12) routes. The revenue effect of the requested changes is negligible. The correct rates should be applied so that equitable and nondiscriminatory rates and charges between all points may be maintained on the basis of the toll plan effective throughout the applicant's service territory in California.

The Commission has considered the request of the applicant and is of the opinion that the authority asked for should be

granted, and that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not required, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company shall:

1. Correct its interexchange telephone rate schedules applicable to messages to and from Calpine toll station as shown in Exhibit "B" attached to this application, effective on or before November 1, 1939.
2. Submit to the Railroad Commission, for filing in accordance with General Order No. 68, the interexchange rates referred to in (1) above not later than ten (10) days immediately preceding their effective date.

For all other purposes the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
