BY THE COMMISSION:

The California Oregon Power Company applies for authority to exercise an electric franchise granted by the City of Tulelake, Siskiyou County, presumably under the terms of the Broughton Act of 1905. A public hearing on the application has been held.

Applicant for many years has rendered electric service within the City of Tulelake by virtue of its constitutional franchise and a franchise granted by the Board of Supervisors of Siskiyou County in 1902. It is evident that the requested authority should be given.

O R D E R

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be and hereby is granted to The California Oregon Power Company to exercise the right or privilege under that certain franchise granted by the City of

Tulelake by Ordinance No. 18 of July 19, 1937, subject to the condition, however, that no claim of value for such franchise or for the authority hereby granted, in excess of the actual cost thereof, shall ever be made by the grantee before this Commission or before any court or other public body.
