FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By supplemental application filed September 11, 1939, William Q. Wright and L.M. Dervin, doing business as Delta Tug Co., seek an order enlarging their "for-hire vessel" operations to permit them to transport cement for the Calaveras Cement Co. from Stockton to the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz Island, San Francisco Bay.¹ They also seek permission to establish a rate of 7½ cents per 100 pounds, minimum weight 100,000 pounds, for this transportation, effective on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the parties affected. Request is not made to operate any new vessel in this service.

The only common carrier now authorized to perform this transportation has been notified of the filing of this application and has advised that it has no objection to the granting thereof.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 30967, as amended, be and it is hereby further amended to permit applicants William

Q. Wright and L.M. Dervin, doing business as Delta Tug Co. to transport cement for the Calaveras Cement Co. from Stockton to the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz Island, San Francisco Bay, subject to the following condition:

Applicants shall file with the Commission in duplicate and make effective within a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date hereof, on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the parties affected, an amendment to their tariff now on file with the Commission adding a rate of $7\frac{1}{2}$ cents per 100 pounds applicable on cement in minimum quantities of 100,000 pounds, transported from Stockton to the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz Island, San Francisco Bay.

In all other respects said Decision No. 30967, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
