OPINION AND ORDER

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, which operates a general telephone business in California and other States, in this application requests authority to correct its filed interexchange rates for service between Clifford Camp, Shasta County and other toll points and between Salt Creek, Shasta County and other toll points.

It is stated in the application that the locations of these toll stations were incorrectly shown on the utility's United States Post Route Map and that this has resulted in certain irregularities in the computation of rates between these toll stations and seven other exchanges and toll stations. The rates over six of these toll routes will be increased five cents each and reduced five cents over the other route. It is necessary that these changes should be made so that equitable and nondiscriminatory rates and charges between all toll points in California may be maintained on the basis of the toll plan effective throughout applicant's service territory in this State.

The Commission has given consideration to the request of applicant and is of the opinion that the authority asked for should

be granted, and that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not required, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company shall:

- (1) Correct its interexchange telephone rate schedules applicable to messages to and from Clifford Camp toll station and to and from Salt Creek toll station as set forth in Exhibit "C" attached to this application, effective on or before December 1, 1939.
- (2) Submit to the Railroad Commission, for filing, the interexchange rates referred to in (1) above not later than ten (10) days immediately preceding their effective date.

For all other purposes the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
