FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 32207 of August 1, 1939, in the above entitled application, John J. Williams, doing business as Williams Transfer Co., a highway contract and city carrier, was authorized to transport paper, paper articles and related commodities for the United States Paper Company between points in the Los Angeles drayage area at lesser charges than those accruing under the minimum rates established in and by Decision No. 31473 of November 25, 1938, as amended, in Case No. 4121. This authority will expire October 31, 1939. By supplemental application this carrier now seeks an extension of the authority until July 31, 1940. It alleges that the conditions existing at the time the original application was granted continue to exist at the present time without material change.

It appears from the application that an extension of the authority heretofore granted is justified and that such an extension may be authorized without the necessity of a formal hearing. However, the matter of readjusting the minimum rates for the transportation involved is now receiving the Commission's consideration in Case No. 4121 and the extension of the authority will be limited, therefore, to December 31, 1939.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted by Decision No. 32207 of August 1, 1939, in the above entitled application, be and it is hereby extended to December 31, 1939, unless sooner changed, modified or cancelled by appropriate order of the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be October 31, 1939.
