FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND OPDER

By Decision No. 31474 of November 25, 1938, in the above entitled application, Goodman Delivery Service, Inc., operating as a city carrier and highway contract carrier, was authorized to transport paper, paper articles and related commodities for various shippers in the Los Angeles drayage area at lesser charges than those accruing under the minimum rates established in and by Decision No. 30600, as amended, in Case No. 4121. This authority will expire October 31, 1939. By supplemental application this carrier now seeks an extension of the authority for one year. It alleges that the conditions existing at the time the original application was granted continue to exist at the present time without material change.

It appears from the application that an extension of the authority heretofore granted is justified and that such extension may be authorized without the necessity of a formal hearing. By decision issued this day, however, rates substantially the same as those which applicant was previously authorized to charge herein are being provided for transportation within the Los Angeles drayage area by carriers generally. This adjustment will become effective January 1, 1940, and the extension of the authority herein will be limited, therefore, to December 31, 1939.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted by Decision No. 31474 of November 25, 1938, in the above entitled application, be and it is hereby extended to December 31, 1939, unless sooner changed, modified or cancelled by appropriate order of the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
