ORDER

Pacific Gas and Electric Company applies for authority to exercise an electric franchise granted by the City of Jackson, Amador County. The franchise is one authorized by the Franchise Act of 1937, and is in lieu of certain asserted franchises under which applicant or its predecessors for many years has rendered electric service within the City. Public hearing has been held and it is evident that the requested authority should be given.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be and hereby is granted to Pacific Gas and Electric Company to exercise the right or privilege under that certain franchise granted by the City of Jackson by Ordinance No. 155 of May 3, 1938, subject to the condition, however, that

no claim of value for such franchise or for the authority hereby granted, in excess of the actual cost thereof, shall ever be made by the grantee before this Commission or any court or other public body.
