In the Matter of the Application of J. T. SHIPLEY, owner of Ripon Telephone Exchange, for authority to establish a rate for public pay station service.

BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

WHEREAS, J. T. Shipley, who owns and operates a telephone system in the town of Ripon and vicinity in San Joaquin County, California, under the name of Ripon Telephone Exchange, having applied to the Railroad Commission of the State of California for authority to file and make effective a rate for public pay station service, and

WHEREAS, the furnishing of public pay station service at five (5) cents per exchange message will be in the interest of subscribers to the service and to the transient public; and it appearing that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is required,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that J. T. Shipley be and he hereby is authorized to charge and collect the sum of five (5) cents for each local message from a public pay station on or before February 1, 1940, provided the rate schedule as shown on Exhibit "A" attached to the application herein is submitted to the Railroad Commission for filing not later than ten (10) days immediately preceding the effective date thereof.
