BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

The City of Culver City is authorized to construct a pedestrian crossing across the Santa Monica Air Line of Pacific Electric Railway Company from Hays Avenue to the foot of Cattaragus Avenue at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 6A-10.48-D. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Pacific Electric Railway Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than six feet and grades of approach not greater than six per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G.O. 72. Protection shall be by special pedestrian signs of a type to be approved by this Commission.

This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall become effective immediately.
