## FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By this supplemental application, Sacramento Northern
Railway requests a further amendment to condition No. 1 of Decision (1)
No. 28766, as amended by Decision No. 31590 which will provide that the suspension of passenger stage service between Oroville and Portola and intermediate points heretofore authorized by said decision will not be contingent upon the operation of comparable train schedules by Western Pacific Railroad Company during the said period of suspension of said stage service.

In support of its petition, applicant alleges that although during the past six months Western Pacific Railroad Company has

maintained/local passenger train service between Croville and

Portola and intermediate points, passenger stage travel has been
(2)
so light as to indicate that operation of passenger train service
as heretofore required by the aforementioned condition No. I should
not be required as a condition precedent to the suspension of
stage service during the winter months.

Under the circumstances, as reported by this applicant, it would appear that Sacramento Northern Railway is now, and has been operating this service at a substantial loss and indications are that winter travel may not be expected to alleviate this condition. It further appears that public demand for this service is not commensurate with the cost of operation entailed in the maintenance of such service. Therefore, public patronage not justifying the out-of-pocket loss incurred in this operation, the application for modification herein presented will be granted.

## OBDER

IT IS HEREBY CRDERED that condition No. 1 of Decision No. 28766, as modified by Decision No. 31590 be and it is further modified to read as follows:

1. In regard to the maintenance of service, Sacramento Northern Railway may suspend the operation of its automotive service between Oroville and Portola, during the month of December and from January 1 to March 31, inclusive of each year.

<sup>(2)</sup> Cost of operations during the period June to September 1939 exceeded revenues by \$1,733.05 on average loss of \$433.26 per month. During October and November of 1939, total passengers eastbound numbered 374 or an average of 6 passengers per day, and westbound 349 passengers, or an average of 5.5 passengers per day.

subject to the following conditions:

1. Applicant shall prepare and file on at least ten (10) days' notice to the Commission and the public a supplement to its tariff in triplicate, and a time schedule in duplicate showing suspension of service as herein authorized.

2. Applicant shall notify the public of this suspension of service by maintaining notices in all

2. Applicant shall notify the public of this suspension of service by maintaining notices in all passenger stages operated on this line for a period of not less than ten (10) days in advance of the time the service is to be suspended each year.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
