ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In the above entitled applications, certain radial high-
way common, highway contract and city carriers sought authority to
charge less than the established minimum rates for the service of
packing used household goods preliminary to shipment, under contract
with the United States Government. By Decision No. 32325 in Case
No. 4246, however, the transportation of used household goods for the
United States Government, as well as accessorial service incidental
thereto, were exempted from the application of the established mini-
mum rates, effective January 1, 1940. After that date, the authority
herein sought will not be necessary and, accordingly, these applica-
tions should be dismissed.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled applications
be and they are hereby dismissed.
