Decision No. BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA ONGINAL In the Matter of the Establishment of maximum or minimum, or maximum and minimum rates, rules and regulations of all common carriers as defined in the Public Utilities Act of the State of California, as Case No. 4246 amended, and all highway carriers as defined in Chapter 223, Statutes of 1935, as amended, for the transportation, for compensation or hire, of any and all commodities. BY THE COMMISSION: SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER By appropriate petition L. L. Peugh, a highway contract carrier, seeks the establishment of a reduced minimum rate of 15 cents per 100 pounds, minimum weight 30,000 pounds, for the transportation of lumber and forest products from San Diego to Imperial. He alleges that a rate of this volume is now in effect for transportation over the joint route of the San Diego and Arizona Eastern Railway and the Southern Pacific Company through the Republic of Mexico and that he cannot compete at a higher rate. It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the sought rate is necessary to place highway carriers on a competitive equality with interstate rail carriers. Since the interstate rail rate applies between railhead points only, however, the highway carriers' rate herein authorized will be similarly restricted. Moreover, the interstate rail rate is published as a temporary rate expiring June 27, 1940, Decision No. 31606, as amended, in the above entitled proceeding, established minimum rates for the transportation of property between points in California. A mileage rate scale was provided for lumber and forest products, the rate applicable thereunder to the transportation involved in the petition being 172 cents per 100 pounds.

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and it appears that the highway carriers rate should be made to expire concurrently.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 31606, as amended, in the above entitled proceeding, be and it is hereby further amended by substituting for First Revised Page 56 therein Second Revised Page 56 which is attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof.

In all other respects said Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
