SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 32492, of October 24, 1939, in this proceeding, authorized The River Lines to suspend common carrier service by vessel for the transportation of passengers between San Francisco and Sacramento until April 1, 1940. By supplemental application filed March 18, 1940, extension of the authorized suspension to May 4, 1940, is sought. It is alleged that the revenue from passenger traffic in prospect for the period involved would be insufficient to defray expenses.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. Authorization of the suspension sought herein will not deprive the public of means of transportation as service is maintained by other carriers. The supplemental application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicants be and they are hereby authorized to continue the suspension of common carrier service by vessel for the transportation of passengers between San Francisco and Sacramento until May 4, 1940, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission, provided they immediately supplement their tariffs on file with the Commission on not less than one (1) day's notice to

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the Commission and to the public to show that their service has been suspended as authorized herein.
