ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a wye track at grade across San Tomas Aquino Road near Vasona Junction. Santa Clara County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crocsing No. L-53.1-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G.O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding one per cent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs, (G.O. No. 75-A) and by suitable lights so arranged and controlled that both sides of trains or cars passing over said crossing at night shall be illuminated.

No train, engine, motor or car shall be operated over said crossing unless said train, engine, motor or car shall be first brought to a stop and traffic on the highway protected by a member of the train crew or other competent employee acting as flagman.

In lieu of said signs, lights and flagman, applicant may, if it so elects, protect the crossing by two Standard No. 3 crossing signals having control circuits approved by the Commission.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authori-

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zation may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately. Dated at San Francisco, ^California, this <u>2</u>^{mad}day of April,
