Public hearing in this matter was held in Needles before Examiner Ager on March 14, 1940, and shortly after concluding the presentation of direct testimony, counsel for applicants requested that a nine months' continuence be granted. This request was made prior to the introduction of any substantial amount of evidence by protestants to refute the claims of applicant that the volume of business was insufficient to justify the continuation of the agency. Subsequently, under date of March 29, 1940, applicants -1made written request that the above application be dismissed, therefore,
