O R D E R

The verified application of The Western Pacific Railroad Company discloses that no passenger or freight business has been transacted at applicant's stations of Grizzly and Gulling on its Gulling Branch for more than one year, that the Interstate Commerce Commission has granted authority for the abandonment of this branch, and that continued maintenance of said stations is not necessary.

Good Cause Appearing, The Western Pacific Railroad Company is authorized to abandon its non-agency stations of Grizzly and Gulling, County of Plumas, to eliminate said names from its station records, and to cancel all tariffs and time schedules applying at said station on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the public.

Within thirty days after abandonment and removal of the facilities, as authorized herein, applicant shall so notify the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended. This order shall be effective immediately.
