

Decision No. 32320

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of the People of the State of California, on relation of the Department of Public Works, for an order authorizing the construction of a crossing at grade of the State highway and the tracks of the Southern Pacific Railroad, near Colusa, County of Colusa, State of California.

O R D E R

ORIGINAL

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct State Highway 15 across the Colusa Branch of Southern Pacific Company near Colusa, Colusa County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. AJ-132.0. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than thirty-six feet and grades of approach not greater than three per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1-A crossing signs. (G. O. No. 75-B).

Upon completion, Crossing No. AJ-131.9, about 450 feet south, shall be abandoned and closed.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
