O R D E R

ORIGINAL

The County of Yuba is authorized to construct 7th Avenue across the main line of The Western Pacific Railroad Company near Marysville, Yuba County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 4-174.9. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Western Pacific Railroad Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than twenty-four feet and grades of approach not greater than six per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs. (G. O. No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
