OPINION AND ORDER

In the above entitled application Robert A. Grimes seeks a permit under the For-Hire Vessel Act (Statutes 1933, Chapter 223) to operate the vessel "Jubilee", with the vessel "Lucky Strike" as an alternate, between Pier 3½ in San Francisco and Immigration and Quarantine docks on Angel Island. Service will be restricted to transportation of members of the crew of the steamship "Columbus" returning from San Francisco to Angel Island, and will be performed under contract with the German Consulate General. The boat will leave Pier 3½ at 11:00 P. M. each night and applicant will receive twelve dollars (\$12) per trip for the service. It is stated in the application that the last Government boat leaves San Francisco at 3:30 P. M. and that the German Consulate wishes to extend the shore leave of the crew to a later hour. The vessel "Jubilee" is said to be Government licensed and equipped with approved safety devices.

The application appears to meet the requirements of the For-Hire Vessel Act and the authority sought will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, to the extent authority of this Commission is required, Robert A. Grimes be and he is hereby authorized to operate, pursuant to the provisions of the For-Hire

Vessel Act, the vessel "Jubilee", with the vessel "Lucky Strike" as an alternate, for transportation of members of the crew of the steamship "Columbus" from Pier 3½ in San Francisco to Angel Island, under contract with the German Consulate General, subject to the following conditions:

1. Applicant shall file a written acceptance of the authority herein granted within a period of not to exceed twenty (20) days from the effective date hereof.
2. Applicant shall file in duplicate with its acceptance of the authority and on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and to the public, two (2) copies of a schedule describing the service to be performed and containing rules and charges which shall conform to those set forth in the application, or other rules and charges satisfactory to the Commission.
3. This authority and the rights and privileges exercisable thereunder shall not be sold, leased, transferred or assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been obtained.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
