BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND ORDER

By this application Marion Hart seeks authority under Section 51(a) of the Public Utilities Act to sell and George E. Jeffery seeks authority to purchase and operate the public utility warehouse property known as Winters Warehouse, located at Winters. It is represented that the purchaser will continue to operate the warehouse at the existing tariff rates and that the service to the public will not be altered. The consideration to be paid is \$9500.

This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Marion Hart be and she is hereby authorized to sell the public utility warehouse property known as Winters Warehouse, located at Winters, to George E. Jeffery, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Applicant Marion Hart shall within sixty (60) days from the date of this order and on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public unite with applicant George E. Jeffery in a common supplement to the tariff now on file with the Commission in the name of Winters Warehouse, applicant Marion Hart withdrawing and applicant George E. Jeffery adopting and establishing such tariff as his own.
- (2) The consideration to be paid for the property herein authorized to be transferred shall never be urged as a measure of value of said property for rate fixing purposes or any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.
- (3) The rights and privileges herein authorized to be conveyed may neither be sold, leased, transferred nor assigned nor may service thereunder be discontinued in the absence of the written authorization of this Commission to such sale, lease, transfer, assignment or discontinuance.
- (4) The authority herein granted shall lapse and be void if the parties hereto shall not have complied with all of the conditions within the period of time fixed herein unless, for good cause shown, the time shall be extended by further order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
