SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

By this first supplemental application Asbury Rapid Transit System requests authority to operate motor coach service on its Pasadena-Hollywood-Ocean Park Division via an alternate routing. Applicant seeks to deviate from its present route approximately five-tenths of a mile over North Figueroa Avenue between Colorado Boulevard and El Modena Avenue, operating instead, a distance of three-tenths of a mile directly over Colorado Boulevard to El Modena Avenue.

Adoption of the alternate routing proposed will enable applicant, it is alleged, to operate over a recently constructed six lane divided highway, eliminate two turns and effect a saving of 17.5 operating miles per day. The new route will be used primarily for the transportation of applicant's through traffic on its Pasadena-Hollywood-Ocean Park Division. No change in schedules or rates is proposed and sufficient service to adequately care for traffic originating or terminating on the old route will be maintained.

This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Asbury Rapid Transit System may, as an alternative, route its buses on its Pasadena-Hollywood-Ocean Park Division via Colorado Boulevard direct to El Modena Avenue in addition to its present route via North Figueroa Street, provided that said alternate route shall be used for the transportation of through passengers only, that adequate service over the existing route shall be maintained, and applicant shall, within fifteen (15) days and on at least five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, file a time schedule in triplicate conforming to the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be five (5) days from the date hereof.
