ORDER

**ORIGINAL**

The City of Huntington Beach is authorized to construct a pedestrian crossing at Third Street across the Newport Line of Pacific Electric Railway Company, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 6E-32.48-D. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Pacific Electric Railway Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not more than eight feet and grades of approach not greater than six per cent. Protection shall be by special pedestrian crossing signs of a type similar to those previously approved for pedestrian crossing protection at other locations on the system of Pacific Electric Railway Company.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
