O R D E R

The verified application of Southern Pacific Company discloses that no passenger or freight business has been transacted at applicant's station of Tico for more than two years and that continued maintenance thereof is not necessary.

Good cause appearing, Southern Pacific Company is authorized to abandon its station of Tico, to abandon and remove a siding approximately 800 feet in length, located at said station, to eliminate said name from its station records and to cancel all tariffs and time schedules applying at said station, on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the public.

Within thirty (30) days after abandonment and removal of the facilities, as authorized herein, applicant shall so notify the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended. This Order shall be effective immediately.
